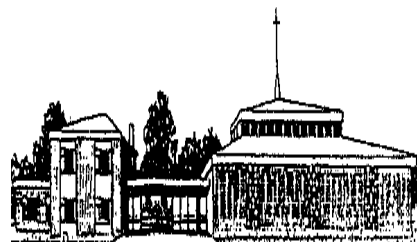

THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS

1st Reading

The prayer of the humble pierces the clouds.

2nd Reading

There is laid up for me the crown of righteousness.

Gospel

The tax collector went down to his house justified, rather than the Pharisee.

Not long ago, we had a weekday reading from Luke 9:18. It was very interesting to know that St Luke's account of Jesus questioning his disciples on who people were saying that he was, took place after praying in their presence. There is something about prayer and identity. Prayer reveals who we are. True prayer flows from the innermost heart. And so, how we pray, what we pray for, where and when we pray say a lot about us. It reveals our relationship with ourselves, God and others.

The Gospel of St Luke we read this Sunday reveals a typical prayer of a humble person and another who is not very humble. The Pharisee's prayer was a litany of his good works. It's about what he had done and accomplished. On the contrary, the tax collector's prayer was not about what he had done well; it's about who he was - a sinner.

A sinner is one who has offended God and neighbour by word, deed or omission. Apart from the Lord's Prayer, the tax collector's prayer had become one of the most simple but powerful prayers of all time: "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Indeed, this man went home, at rights with God. The other did not.
