

#### THIS SUNDAY'S READINGS

1<sup>st</sup> **Reading** We are witnesses to these things, and so is the Holy Spirit.

2nd Reading

Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth.

Gospel

Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and so with the fish.

Who wants to get into trouble? And we know we can't be too careful in life.

Imagine being one of the apostles, who had been summoned by the high priest in these stern words: "We gave you a formal warning not to preach in the name of Jesus."

The accusation was that of civil disobedience. The apostles would respond that obedience to God comes first before obedience to humans. What a courageous thing to say before the authority. Such can only be inspired by the power of the resurrection.

It takes courage to trust and hope in a hopeless situation. The post resurrection experience of the apostles seemed hopelessly devastating. It was such a situation that made the apostles go back to their original fishing trade. But Jesus was not too far away from them. He appeared like a total stranger, urging them never to give up even when they had caught no fish all night.

And they recognised him at the meal. Like the apostles, we are invited to recognise and remember him always at the Eucharistic meal. At the same Eucharist, we recognise our unworthiness like Peter, and appreciate the worthy lamb who was slain; who has every right to receive honour, glory and praise.
